Only 59 votes were cast in a quiet school election here Monday. All incumbents were re-elected with only a

Herman Roesse was re-elected treasurer, receiving 52 votes. The proposed 3/4 mill tax levy for the Merged Area V Community College District was favored by 42 votes here while 16 opposed it. The measure, needing only a simple majority, was favored by 59% of the voters in the district.

At its reorganization of the school board meeting on Monday evening, the board of the directors of the Pomeroy Community School District elected Jerry Michael as its president, succeeding Louis Heide. Mr. Heide was named vice-president.

Robert Sexton, chairman of the Calhoun ABC County Committee, announced today that authorization has been received from Washington to offer for sale many more CCC bins in Calhoun County. ### Long-term Care Ombudsman cuts

AFSCME Council 61 President Danny Homan issued the following statement in response to budget cuts eliminating in-state travel for Long-Term Care Ombudsmen: "On the same day that the Governor is celebrating the creation of 50 jobs in exchange for \$207.8 million in tax breaks, it was brought to light that older Iowans are now more vulnerable

than ever. Somehow, she can hand out even more of our already-decimated state budget to huge companies like Apple, but can't seem to find room for the most basic protections for Iowa's seniors.

"The Office of Long-Term Care Ombudsman is already understaffed, and these additional cuts limit current staff from effectively doing their job. The elimination of in-state travel for the ombudsmen charged with investigating abuse and neglect leaves care facilities without much-needed oversight. In an era of money-hungry private companies running our state's Medicaid program, we simply can't afford to compromise on basic principles like safety and dignity. Governor Reynolds cannot claim to care about older Iowans with shameful actions like this."
