Walter Herbert Richards who served in World War II. He spent 22 months and 15 days in the Navy completing five invasions in the Pacific aboard the amphibious cargo ship. On the ship the USS Alshain he manned the radar station. Following his discharge, he returned home Dec. 22, 1945, to his wife Margaret and 4-year old son in time for Christmas.

He was called to ministry and pastored several Free Will Baptist Churches including Evergreen Free Will Baptist. Their second child, Marilu was born in 1952. He and his wife were schoolteachers in Iola and other towns. He

preached his final sermon at age 92 and is now 99. His wife died seven years ago.
