Developer to apply for \$750,000 grant

May 5 letter to Mayor Judy Hetherly, are contingent upon receiving the \$750,000 grant. Developers believe the Lampasas project will score high enough to be guaranteed funding from the Texas Capital Fund.

Work on the assisted-living center site near Old Georgetown Road and Crider Lane could begin by the fall, Colonial Court health care consultant Teresa Shook said during Monday's meeting. If the company receives grant funding, it must install infrastructure, build the assisted-living center and fill all 38 employee positions within three years.

Mayor Pro Tem Les Gerhardt and council members John Cole, TJ Monroe, Brad Neely and Evan Stubbs voted to approve the preliminary grant application. Councilman Jerry Grayson abstained.

Ms. Hetherly and City Manager Michael Stoldt were not present at

Monday's meeting, as they were away discussing an economic development matter.

Also at the recent meeting, the council:

- approved the purchase of not more than \$32,000 of 100 LL fuel to sell at the Lampasas Municipal Airport. That amount should purchase about 7,000 gallons at an estimated \$4.49 per gallon, Airport Manager Micky Tower said.

- OK'd a free swim day June 25 at Hancock Springs Free-Flow Swimming Pool as part of the pool's 100th anniversary celebration.

- agreed to host a chuck wagon cookoff at the south end of Campbell Park next year during Bloomin' Fest. Police Chief Tim Angermann said the park should be a safer location than the East Fourth Street site where the cookoff was held this year, as he said students will not have to cross the street to view displays at the event.

DWI charge nets four years' jail time

In recent 27th District Court action with Judge Joe Carroll presiding, Leroy Henry Jones, 51, received four years in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Institutional Division for driving while intoxicated third or more. Jones also must pay court costs.

Demetrius Brown's charge of assault family member two times or more was reduced to a Class A misdemeanor. The 43-year-old received a four-month sentence in the Lampasas County Jail.

Briggs resident Michelle Gay Sirianni, 35, was given three years' deferred adjudication probation and a \$500 fine for possession of a controlled substance less than one gram. She also must pay \$140 restitution.

Pleas are expected to be entered today by Jesse Robert Ford, 30, of Lampasas for burglary of a habitation and unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon.

Also set today is a revocation hearing for Johnette Sanchez, 43, of Belton for delivery of a controlled substance.

For burglary of a habitation, 44-year-old Gatesville resident Linda Hella Gerec is to have a punishment hearing today.

Alejandro B. Suchil, 32, of Lometa is scheduled to have a hearing on a motion today. He is charged with assault causing bodily injury: family member.

Thomas Ed Maultsby, 50, of Killeen had his bond reduced to \$7,500. He faces a May 20 adjudication hearing for possession of a controlled substance over one gram and less than four grams.

On a charge of indecency with a child sexual contact, Derek Richard Carter, 22, of Lampasas is to enter a plea May 20.

Bobby Joe Hamilton, 44, of Lampasas is set for a pretrial hearing May 20 on a charge of indecency with a child exposes.

A pretrial hearing is on the May 20 docket for Kenneth Eugene Bush, 47,

of Copperas Cove for sexual abuse of a child continuous: victim under 14.

For driving while intoxicated and felony repetition, Adam Blake Hobill, 32, of Lampasas is set for a June 10 pretrial.

Pretrials are June 17 for Molly Roesler Lesley, 28, of Lampasas for sexual assault of a child; Steven Ray Gant, 47, of Lampasas for bail jumping and failure to appear felony, as well as driving while intoxicated third or more; and Domonique Deshoun Gatlin, 27, of Kempner for arson.

Kempner resident Ashley Lynn Norton, 29, is set to enter a plea June 17 on a charge of tamper/fabricate physical evidence.

A punishment hearing is on the June 17 docket for Brian Stephen Ahearn, 54, of Lampasas for driving while intoxicated and felony repetition.

Stonewall resident Kelly Bruce Jenkins, 43, is to enter a plea June 24 on a charge of criminal non-support.

Christopher Vega, 33, had his bond set at \$1,500 and is up for a review June 24. He is charged with bond jumping.

On a charge of driving while intoxicated third or more, James William Bowen, 45, of Lampasas is to enter a plea July 15.

Twenty-one-year-old Raymond Smith of Lampasas is set for a review on July 15. He is charged with theft over \$1,500 and under \$20,000.

Sentencing is July 22 for Fred John Beezer, 68, of San Antonio on a charge of theft over \$20,000 and under \$100,000.

For forgery of a financial instrument, James Douglas Straley, 41, of Lampasas is slated for a July 25 jury trial.

Hope M. Hatto, 25, will face an Aug. 29 jury trial on a charge of credit card abuse.

And in a case of assault causes bodily injury family violence enhanced against Charles Anthony Leigh, 34, of Lampasas, the judge denied revocation of Leigh's bond and amended his probation.

Senate adopts SB 14 report

The Texas Senate adopted the conference committee report on Senate Bill 14 authored by Senator Troy Fraser (R-Horseshoe Bay). SB 14 would increase confidence that in-person voter fraud does not occur by requiring that each voter show photo identification before being able to cast a vote.

"Photo ID is simply putting into practice the intent of the current law -- that the person who shows up at the polls is who he or she claims to be," said Fraser. "Voter impersonation is a serious crime, but without a photo ID requirement we can never have confidence in our system of voting."

Under the legislation, a voter would be required to show either a Texas driver's license or identification card, a U.S. military ID card, a U.S. passport, a Texas concealed handgun license, or a U.S. citizenship certificate that contains a photo before casting a ballot. The bill also would increase the penalties for committing voter fraud.

"Polls show that people are less likely to vote if they believe their ballot will not be fairly counted," Fraser said.

The conference committee report for Senate Bill 14 is now before the Texas House of Representatives for a final vote. Once adopted by the House, it will go to the governor for his signature.
