## County history meets modern methods in Courthouse basement

This year has been a busy one for Young County Clerk, Kay Hardin, who has been hard at work overseeing the transition to a more efficient method of document filing that incorporates the convenience of the digital world.

For those researching genealogies, marriages or simply deeds, Hardin's office has put in hours digitizing troves of documents. "It used to be that when you came in [and needed a document], they would have to locate the file in the book, make sure the paper was a good copy, send that to the copier, and scan it," she said. "Now what they can do is pull your file up on the computer and print it."

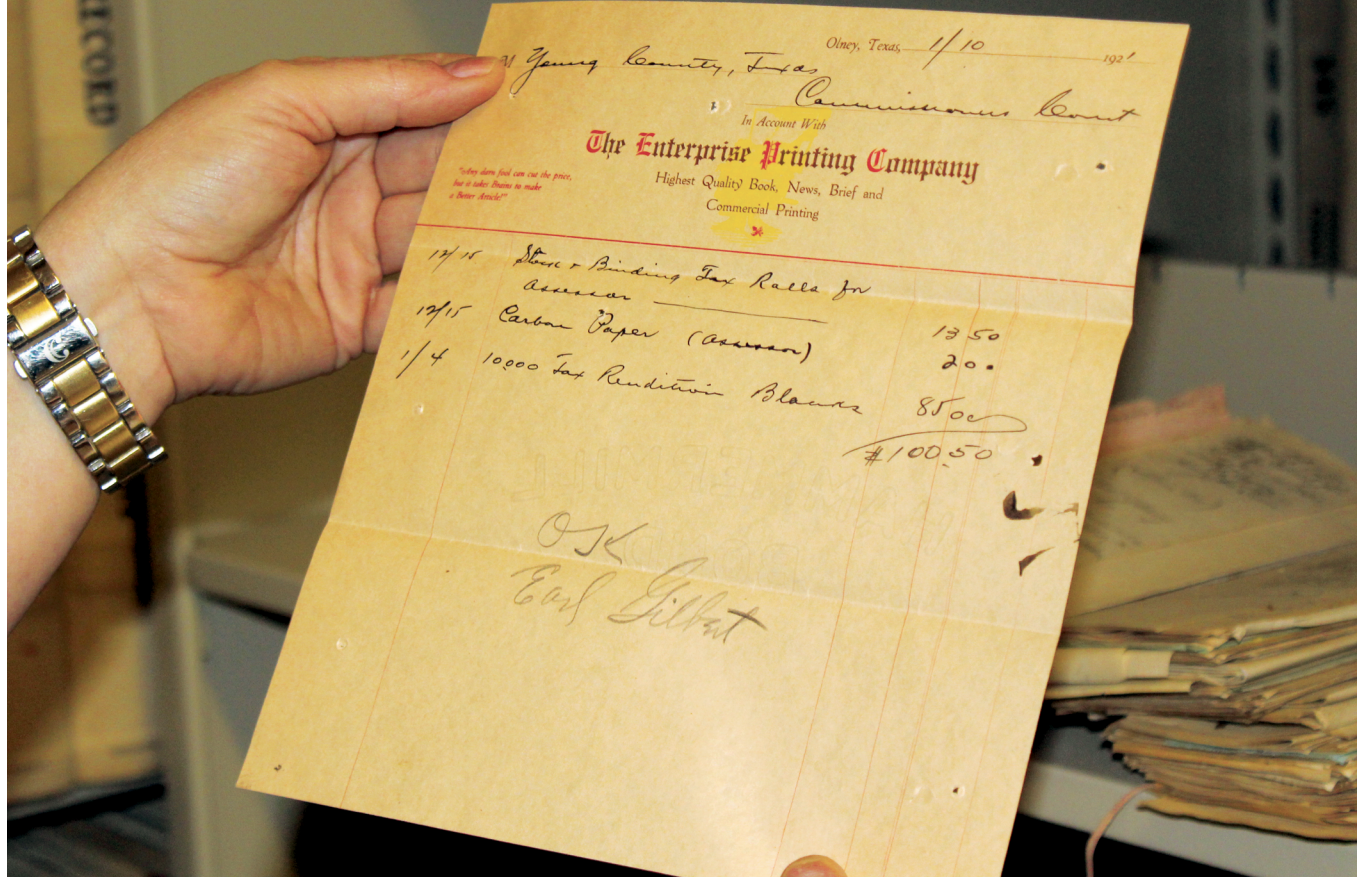
For those files not scanned into the computer, a simpler filing system has been installed in the Courthouse basement. The new system trades files in shucks inside big boxes for folders organized on rows of mechanical shelves.

The new filing system is also set to make the process of locating and retrieving documents easier for everyone involved, Hardin said.

"It will now be easier for us to go downstairs, find the file, and then bring it up to the person instead of having to locate the box," she said. "It is supposed to give us eight to 10 years of growth. That was the reason I got the filing system."

This transition began with and was developed by the

## Midwestern State University recognizes area honor roll students

WICHITA FALLS, Texas (December 21, 2017) - Midwestern State University recognized 1,184 honor students for the Fall 2017 semester.
